to be grateful for each new day,


that we might make the most of the gifts that you have given.


A prayer led by the Speaker's Chaplain in the House of Commons:

So we pray for all those who worship in secret, afraid to speak their faith out loud and for all those who keep their Bibles hidden.


We think of those who have spoken out and have been given long prison sentences for daring to worship you. We pray for their families.
